Steve Albert, age 68, passed away in Bellingham on Monday, September 13, 2010. He was born to Pauline and Jack Albert on September 4, 1942 in Seattle, WA. Growing up on Puget Sound fostered his love of boating. As a Navy pilot, he completed two combat tours in Viet Nam earning several awards including Air Medal (5 awards), Viet Nam Service Medal with 4 bronze stars, and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry. Later he spent 25 years as an Air Traffic Controller for the Federal Aviation Administration in Shreveport, Louisiana. Upon his retirement, he moved back to Washington State.
